The Challenge

- The U.S. faces a critical shortage of credentialed merchant mariners, officers, and skilled maritime professionals.
- This shortage threatens commerce, energy supply chains, and national security sealift capacity.
- A gap of 1,800+ qualified officers has already been identified, with numbers expected to grow.
- Awareness of maritime careers among American youth is extremely low.

The Solution

Create a Scouting Maritime Industry Merit Badge:

- Modeled after badges like Aviation and Railroading.
- Introduce Scouts to seamanship, navigation, shipbuilding, ports, logistics, and environmental stewardship.
- Highlight the service mission of the U.S. Merchant Marine.
- Build a pipeline from Scouting → Academies/Training → Workforce.

Why Scouting?

- Scouting reaches 1M+ youth annually with proven career-path badges.
- Trusted by families, educators, and employers.
- Provides a respected platform to spark exploration of maritime careers that offer high-wages, highdemand pathways in shipping, port logistics, shipbuilding, pilotage and emerging fields.

- Strengthen Workforce: Builds future mariners, officers, and maritime professionals.
- Support Industry: Engages ports, unions, carriers, academies, and shipyards as badge counselors/hosts.
- Secure the Future: Supports U.S. economic vitality and national sealift readiness.
- High Impact, Low Cost: Mobilizes existing youth infrastructure to address a national workforce crisis.
